



## L E T T E R XIII.

MY LORD,

**T**HE Colonies of *Connecticut*, *Rhode Island*, and *New Hampshire* come naturally under Consideration next after *New England*, of which they originally were, and still in most Respects may be considered as a Part; the Observations therefore made upon that are all necessarily applicable to these it's younger Brethren.

The Produce of these Colonies is mostly the same as that of *New England*; and their Trade with *Great Britain* carried on in the same Articles, and so blended with it, that it is more difficult, than it may seem necessary, to draw the Line between them in many particulars. However, in order to throw as much Light as possible upon so interesting a Subject, I here lay before your Lordship a State of their separate Trade, as far as it is carried on with any apparent Separation.
