longer bear such neglect. Mobs, it seems, were organized at all the drinking houses, to express their indignation at such unparalleled neglect on the part of the government. The effects of an over indulgence in liquor afforded the materials for a general outbreak, which Gen. Smith and his officers endeavoted to queil; but, after exhausting his patience, and despairing of being able to put an end to the innumerable crimes publicly commuted, had, for his own personal safety, taken shelter on board the slope of war in the harbor. If such be the order of things in San Finneisco, what may we expect to hear from the gold diggings? Much discontent is manifested, on the part of the Americans and California ans, that the rich deposits of gold are thrown open to foreigners who are arriving, in regular organized and armed parties, from all places on the Pacific, for the sole jurpose of digging and car rying away the gold. Such is the inflax of fore guers, that from Mexico alone, 50,000 had gone. Some fifty persons had arrived at Mazatlan from California, who gave a most deplarable recount of the state of the country. They found the Yankees to a much for them, even at their own game—maning. There will be no more emigration from Mexico. The placers of Smora are drawing people in that direction. They are said to be richer than those of California.
