



Montreal's New Floating Dock

The largest battleship being built or projected will find accommodation, in case of accident or necessity for inspection below the water-line, in the new floating dock which will be located at the east end of the Harbor of Montreal. The huge dock, the second largest in the world, has been built at Barrow-in-Furness, and will be towed across the Atlantic. The voyage will be reminiscent of the old sailing vessel days, for it will take two months to transport this great bulk across. The dock, which has been christened "The Duke of Connaught," is 600 feet long, 105 feet wide, 60 feet deep, and draws 32 feet of water.
