THE SPECIFIC ISSUES WILL HAVE TO BE MODERATED.

Rule #1: THERE ARE NO QUICK FIXES.

THE RULE ISN'T CHANGED, BUT THE PUBLIC
PERCEPTION HAS. AS THE ISSUES AT PLAY ARE OF
INCREASING PUBLIC IMPACT, THERE IS A NEED TO SEE
SWIFT ACTION TO DEAL WITH THEM. CERTAINLY ACID RAIN
IS OF THIS CATEGORY. POSSIBLY SOME OF CANADA'S
ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES AS WELL. THIS IS NOT TO SAY THAT THE ISSUES
CAN BE RESOLVED ANY FASTER BUT IT IS TO ACKNOWLEDGE
THAT BOTH GOVERNMENTS HAVE TO BE SEEN ADDRESSING THEM
AS MATTERS OF GREATER URGENCY.

Rule #2: NO PUBLIC DIPLOMACY, HAS ALSO CHANGED IN
CONSEQUENCE.

INFORMATION AND EXPLANATIONS ON THEIR GOVERNMENT'S
