

THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF CANADA.

BILL 16.

An Act respecting the Grand Trunk Pacific Branch Lines Company.

WHEREAS a petition has been presented praying that it be enacted as herein after set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Preamble.

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 3 of chapter 83 of the statutes of 1911, the Grand Trunk Pacific Branch Lines Company may commence the construction of the lines of railway heretofore authorized within two years after the passing of this Act, and may complete the said lines of railway and put them in operation within five years after the passing of this Act; and if the said lines of railway are not so commenced, or are not so completed and put in operation within the said periods, respectively, the powers of construction conferred upon the said company by Parliament shall cease and be null and void as respects so much of the said lines of railway as then remains uncompleted.

Time for construction of railways extended.
