

line of farms if any bonus or premium under this By-Law shall have been paid therefor) or suffers or permits any animal in his charge to injure or destroy, or who cuts down or removes any such tree without having first obtained permission to do so by special resolution of the said Council, shall upon conviction thereof before a Justice of the Peace for the County of Brant forfeit and pay such sum of money, not exceeding twenty-five dollars besides costs, as such Justice may award, and in default of payment, the same may be levied of the goods and chattels of the person offending, or such person may be imprisoned in the common gaol of the County of Brant for a period not exceeding thirty days.

9th—That one half of any fine imposed under the authority of this By Law shall go to the person laying the information, and the other half to the Treasurer of the said Township for the uses thereof,

10th—That By-Law No. 269 of the said Township relating to the planting of trees therein is hereby repealed.

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BY-LAW No. 281.

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FOR REGULATING PUBLIC SHOWS AND LICENSING THE SAME.

The Corporation of the Township of Brantford, now in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the authority therein vested, enacts as follows:

1st—That upon and immediately after the passing of this By-Law there shall be taken out by every person or persons opening any place for the exhibition of wax-work menageries, circus riding and other such like shows usually exhibited by showmen to be held for profit in the Township of Brantford, a license, for which said license the person or persons obtaining the same shall pay at the time of taking out such license the following sums, that is to say:

2nd—For exhibiting pictures or other works of Art, or natural or artificial curiosities, panoramas, tableaux or other exhibitions of a like nature, for each time of exhibiting the same the sum of five dollars.

3rd—For exhibiting every circus or menagerie the sum of fifty dollars per day, and for every side show or other entertainment connected or associated with such circus or menagerie the sum of five dollars.
