

record in a book, correct minutes of proceedings, to attend all parades with his roll book, to call the names at the hour named, to collect all fines, dues and fines from the members, and pay them over to the Treasurer, and generally, to perform such duties and services as may be regarded by the commanding officer, consistent with the duties of a clerk.

XIV.

In case of decease of any member, the Battery shall attend his funeral in full uniform, paying such honors as are due to the rank of deceased, unless contrary to the wishes of deceased, or his relatives.

XV.

The foregoing constitution Rules and Bylaws shall not be altered, amended, or repealed, except by consent of two thirds of the members present at any monthly meeting, and one months notice of such repeal or amendment shall be given in writing, stating the nature thereof. No such amendment or alteration to be in force until it has the approval of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief.
