Past President Nelson Gives Notice of Three Amendments—O'Connor Proposes Several.

Last night Past President Nelson sent in notice of three amendments to Secretary Hall.

Proposes that clubs that have not played at least one association match in the previous season shall not be entitled to representation at the annual meeting. This is intended to restrict the practice of carrying inactive clubs on the membership roll just for voting purposes.

Another proposal is that the senior clubs shall have the right to take part in any of the association legislation, except what refers directly to that series. That is, that the professional club managers the affairs of an amateur body, and that senior representatives shall not be eligible for officers of an amateur association.

A third would put the appointment of referees in the hands of the secretary instead of the president, as now. This is the case in all other governing bodies of this kind.

The last amendment was suggested by Secretary H. Hall. He received several amendments yesterday from Tom O'Connor (of the Lacrosse Club).

No. O'Connor's amendment is that "No person except club delegates and the referee shall be entitled to vote at an annual meeting." That would exclude all others, past or present, from the voting power.

No. O'Connor next seeks to amend the regulation which prohibits more than one vote for any one club or town or village on the same day by having a vote on public holidays in Toronto.

O'Connor also makes the latest date for the releasing of players the 5th of July, and also wants to have a rule in force that no player shall be allowed to play for a second team until he has been released by the first.
