teating aspersions upon the good fame of an innocent man. From time to time the matter came up in the council only to meet the same fate, until last year the Mayor took the bull by the horns and insisted on appointing an expert accountant to investigate.

Mr. Powis reported that when he asked the Treasurer for a balance sheet of the ledger as it stood on 31st December, 1895, as a starting point from which to work, he was informed that there was no ledger in existence. A book was produced which showed the various accounts, merely a receipt and expenditure account, and found that there was no ledger account showing the debentures.

When the second report was presented in council, Mr. Calvert made a statement to the following effect: That the Treasurer was in 1891, and accounted \$12,000 of the city's money from the special account to the general account, and that the amount of the discount, \$191.34, was never credited to the special account.

After dealing of these startling revelations the council determined upon a full investigation of the accounts for the previous five years, and Mr. George Edwards, chartered accountant of Toronto, was engaged to audit the accounts. On 1st June, 1896, he presented his interim report, stating that the amount which he had ascertained as being due to the city was \$4,889.13.

AGAIN REPORTED TO THE COUNCIL

results of a further examination of the accounts of the sinking fund, as follows: The revenue for the year 1894, in so far as it was susceptible of audit, had been duly accounted for, with the exception of certain items which appeared in the minutes of council as assumed, were non-collectable, referring to payments due in connection with the use of the Exhibition grounds, as follows: Sons of England demonstration, \$15; P. Barrett, \$10; J. Farrell, \$25.

The expenditures were apparently satisfactory so far as they went, but he could not give a certificate of correctness owing to not having been supplied with statement of accounts for audit. The report, presented upon council the necessity of making certain reforms in the system, as follows: That the amount received by the bank in the amount of orders and cheques passing through the bank; the recording in the minutes of council of all accounts passed by council; proper filing of all accounts paid; the correction of the sinking fund, and the preparation of a properly balanced ledger at once.

Officials Don't Give Any Information. A representative of The World Intelligencer inquired of the Mayor's office today. Although the Mayor is entitled to a great deal of credit for the very fact that he has not disclosed this matter to an issue, he was very reticent upon the subject, and declined to give any information beyond what had already been published.

What the Treasurer Claims. The Treasurer claims that he retained these various sums of money in order to recoup himself for expenditures for traveling expenses in delivering the sinking fund, and he presented no accounts for the same to the council, and Mr. Edwards reports that the amount accounted for is many times over in excess of the fair allowance for traveling expenses.
