OUERIES REGARDING MILITARY SERVICE

Address Your Problems to the Milltary Editor of The Advertiser and They W I Be Answered From Off cial Information.

FARMER. Q.—I am 25 years of age and am exempted as long as I remain larming. When this work is finished am I at liberty to work at whatever capacity I desire?

whatever capacity I desire?

A.—No. You are permitted to work at lumbering or other necessary work during the winter months and should notify the deputy registrar of any change of address. You will likely be allowed to work as you desire in the near future when your case will be struck off the records of the deputy registrar. Until then it would be advisable for you to obey regulations under the military service act, which has not yet been totally suspended.

RETURNED SOLDIER .- The mil-RETURNED SOLDIER.—The mil-ltary authorities here have informed The London Advertiser that all sol-diers who are sent home from over-seas and discharged as minors are not entitled to receive three months' post discharge pay, and therefore, you will have no claim for same, as this orders covers your case.

T. H. E. Q.—I have been in the Canadian Engineers in this city for two months, and have now been dis-charged. Ten dollars had been decharged. Ten dollars had been de-ducted from my pay for my uniform, and on discharge I was informed by the paymaster that I had forfelted the ten dollars, although I had a kit clearance on discharge, and was never deficient in any way. If I am entitled to the ten dollars, to whom

should I apply for a refund? should I apply for a refund?

A.—If the facts are as you state and your kit was never deficient you are entitled to the ten dollars, which is part of your own pay held until discharge to cover deficiencies. If your paymaster refuses to pay same, write with full facts of the case to the A. A. G., M. D. No. 1, Wolseley Barracks, London, Ont., winking your regimental number, rank giving your regimental number, rank, and name, and the case will be investigated and all moneys due you refunded.

SUESCRIBER. Q.-I have a son who died in the Canadian army while proceeding overseas. His body is buried in Liverpool, England, and i wish to bring the remains home to Canada. To whom would i apply for permission to do this?

A.—Write a letter, with full facts of case (son's regimental number, unit, rank, name and date of death) to the District Intelligence Officer, Wolseley District Intelligence Officer, Wolseley Barracks, London, Ont., and he will advise you as to correct procedure in or-der to facilitate matters as you desire.


