

A NIGHT IN THE MARDON THE SIGHTS ONE CAN SEE

Odd Scenes to Be Witnessed During Warm Spell in City's Cosmopolitan Section.

The average citizen strolling thru "the ward" last night would have been amazed at the cosmopolitan aspect it is assuming.

On one street corner stood a half dozen pushcarts, manned by swarthy sons of Italy, selling dairy ice cream, one cent a cone; long-whiskered Hebrews selling bananas and other fruits by the cent's worth, and hundreds of the denizens of the ward surrounding these pushcart merchants and purchasing their wares.

The most interesting sight of all is the chicken merchant, who has as an ally a rabbi ready to kill the fowl for his customers, and this merchant also sells portions of a fowl to those who cannot purchase a whole.

The butcher shops, of which there are a dozen or so in the district bounded by Yonge and University and Queen and College-streets, are all filled with women, who are purchasing their supply of meat, as the Hebrews do all their cooking on Friday for the Sabbath and the people have not the time to do any shopping on Friday.

Then once notices the number of ice cream parlors which abound in this district, which are all crowded with perspiring people eating ice cream and drinking ice cold sodawater in their efforts to get a little relief from the terrible heat of the district.

Among the nationalities reported in the ward are Turks, Russians, Poles, Italians, Jews, Rumanians, Macedonians, Slovaks, negroes, Frenchmen and Germans.

BANKERS ARRESTED. Admit They Used Inflation Funds to Sustain Mining Concern.

NEW YORK, July 30.—Two prominent Brooklynites, Col. Edward P. Britton, president until yesterday of the Eagle Savings and Loan Company of that borough, and quarantine commissioner Frederick H. Schroeder, second vice-president, until yesterday of the same institution, were arrested after being indicted on a charge of grand larceny.

Both admit that they took approximately \$4,000 of the cash of the company and used the money to keep the Homestake South Extension Mining Company, a South Dakota concern, upon its feet.
