Seventy-five students of the Fourth Year obtained the degree of Doctor of Medicine, and 128 new students began the study of medicine this year.

In addition to the regular graduate courses which have been carried on during the months of May and June of each year since 1896, a special graduate course has been instituted in Public Health and Sanitary Science. Candidates taking this course must possess a degree in medicine, or other qualifications for practice, and attend a six months' course in labora-
