All that parcel of land situate in the ~~Fah-ha-cum Indian~~ ^{Fah-ha-cum Indian}
~~reserve Number One in Section thirty-four,~~ ^{of the Matthews Band of Indians} Township sixteen,
East of the ~~Coast Meridian~~ ^{Coast Meridian} in the District of New Westminster,
Province of British Columbia and Dominion of Canada, containing

two acres and seven-tenths of an acre more or less and being
~~lying east of and adjacent to the Can. Pac. Ry. & right of way~~ ^{and being}
composed of a strip of land fifty feet in width on each side
of the centre line of the right of way of the Vancouver Power
Company, ~~now known as the British Columbia Electric Railway~~
Company, the said centre line being more particularly described
as follows,-

COMMENCING at a point on the North boundary of said reserve
distant nine hundred and eighty-^{nine} ~~six~~ feet and six-tenths of a
foot measured westerly along the said North boundary from the
North East corner of the said reserve; thence South ^{sixteen} ~~fourteen~~
~~degrees, forty-four minutes and thirty seconds East~~ ^{southerly and parallel to the Can. Pac. Ry. & right of way} one thousand
one hundred and sixty-three feet more or less to the intersec-
tion of the said centre line with the South boundary of the
said reserve. The said right of way being shown on a plan of
survey by A. E. B. Hill, British Columbia Land Surveyor, dated ~~14th~~ ^{June}
~~September~~ 1914 and recorded in the Surveys Branch of the Depart-
ment of Indian Affairs under Number BR 1438-A. Provided and
it is hereby expressly declared that this patent is issued and
accepted with the understanding that the said Company will con-
struct and maintain farm crossings at points where the said
right of way is crossed by existing trails or roads or at such
other points as the Department of Indian Affairs may request
and without recourse against the Dominion Government in event
of the establishment of any claim on the part of or under the
Province of British Columbia to the said land or any interest
therein.
