record breaker in turf history, while the fast marks made both in the world's championship table and season's marks were beyond all expectations. The com-plete returns show that during the sea-son a total of twenty-seven names were added to the 2,10 trotting list. The new list is headed by Brighton S., Linda Wrona and Margaret Druien, all with records of 2.05½ while twenty-three took records of 2.06 or better, which is ten percent of the total num-ber of trotters in the entire division. In the whole list thirty-two of the total gained their marks in starts against time, records which will not interfere with their eligibility next year, while of the twenty-three in the 2.08 class only four were started against time, indicat-ing that the fastest performers made their best showing in actual races. All seventeen that reduced their for-mer fast marks also took their records in races except Anvil, who heads the list with 2.02%. Of these five entered the 2.05 list, while two that were in that class—Anvil and Peter Volo—brought their marks to the lower figures. This brings the total number of 2.05 trotters up to 48. The average record of the sev-enteen is exactly 2,04, while previous to 1914 only sixteen horses were in the 2.04 list, some of which secured their marks in time trials, and two behind wind shields, while this year all except one have race records. The Pacers For the first time in five years the in-crease in the number of 2.10 pacers falls short in comparison with the number of fast trotters. A total of 110 new names were added to the season's fast racing list, while thirty-nine pacers al-ready in the 2.10 section previous to 1914 reduced their records. The speed exhibition pacing was phe-nomenal during the season, and it was no wonder that many world's champion-ship marks were lowered or equalled, all in actual racing. No less than ten of the new "two-tenners" entered the 2.05 class while sixteen others paced to record from 2.05½ to 2.06. The Pacers




