

MYSTERY IN DEATH OF YOUNG ICEMAN

Body Found in a Lighted
Room—Letters Indicate a
Quarrel With Woman.

Glen Cove, L. I., Oct. 27.—Puzzling
circumstances surround the death here
on Sunday of Joseph Mitchell, a youth
who delivered ice. His viscera have been
sent to a laboratory in New York for
analysis because an autopsy failed to
clear the mystery.

Mitchell occupied two rooms with a
woman who was understood to be his
mother. This woman went away about
two weeks ago. She is believed to have
gone to Suffolk county. Letters found
in the rooms indicated that Mitchell had
quarrelled with a woman who signed
herself "Florence" and who begged the
boy to take her back, as she was un-
happy.

The boy's body was found in bed on
Monday when his employers missed
him. Lights had been burning since

paper. On it was written, apparently
in his hand, a "mammy" lullaby in
which the Lord's Prayer was interwoven.
On the floor near the bed were
pieces of candy.

The autopsy disclosed that the stom-
ach apparently had reacted to some
irritant. There were signs of a heart
lesion, but it was believed that this
might have been due to the strain of
handling ice.


Death apparently was unexpected; at
least Mitchell left no note behind him.
The district attorney's office is in-
vestigating and hopes soon to learn more
about Mitchell from his erstwhile com-
panion.

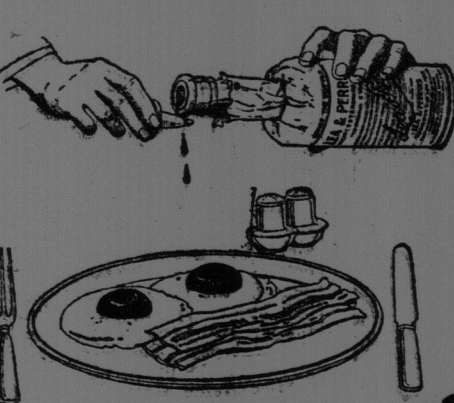

Jermyn he would have been convicted.

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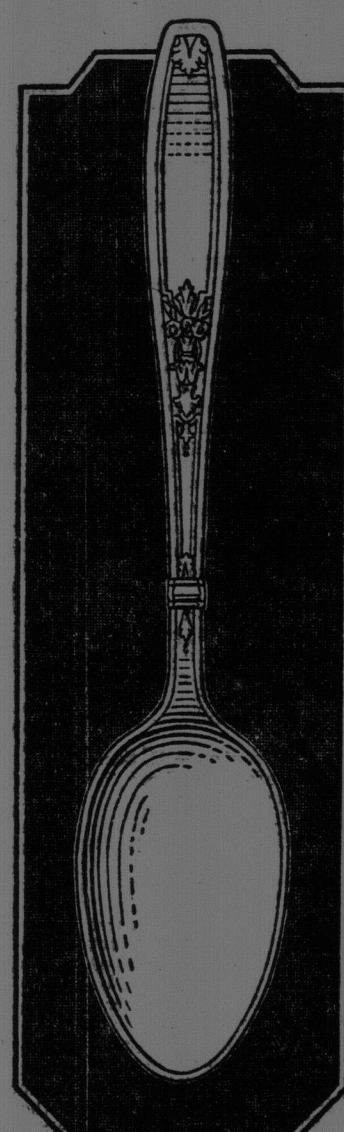
