# ONE TO PRISON FOR BOND THEFT IN WALL STREET

Clerk Who Turned State's Evidence Sentenced

Excrement Under Examination in New York and Valuable Information Reported Given—Montreal End of Some Operations.

New York, May 15—Turning state's evidence against men wanted in connection with New York's \$500,000 bond theft plot, failed to win clemency for Donald C. Bergess, a clerk who yesterday was sentenced from one to two years in state prison, after confessing to the theft of \$200,000 worth of bonds from a Wall Street brokerage firm.

Raymond F. Cooney, who was indicted with Bergess, and arrested in Indianapolis, had also pleaded guilty and will be sentenced next week.

While the whereabouts of the elusive Jules W. "Nicky" Arnstein, alleged "master-mind," continued to remain a mystery, Assistant District Attorney Dooling had before him for questioning E. C. Ebermont, a former Canadian M. P., who was brought here from Chicago in connection with the bond thefts. Dooling said that as a result of the examination he had received valuable information, which will probably connect the link between Morty Bernstein, who died two weeks ago, and Philip F. Kasel, an important missing witness. Detectives who have been working on

an attack of heart trouble, but that he would be all right to appear that evening. At 6.50 I arrived at the theatre in a coach, so weak that he could hardly walk. I assisted him to the dressing room and told him that he was too ill to work, and that I would call the show off. He went on and within a few minutes after the curtain went up he was forced to leave the stage and collapsed behind the scenes and was carried to the dressing room in
