MANY IN RUSH TO SCENE OF GOLD STRIKE

Shushanna in Alaska is Big Magnet to the Wealth Seekers (Victoria Colonist)

At the present time there is an unusual demand at the local steamship offices for transportation to the nearest point of embarkation for Shushanna diggings, the new El Dorado of the Far West.

At Vancouver tonight she will pick up a large number of northbound passengers, the majority of whom are heading in the direction of the new fields. A small herd of cattle is being shipped at Vancouver today, and upon their arrival at Skagway will be shipped by rail to Whitehorse and from thence by trail to Shushanna.

The general agent of the C. P. R. at Skagway has forwarded a report to the heads of departments, which states that the latest accounts point to a genuine strike of placer gold thirty-five miles from the Alaska-Yukon boundary, on the American side, a point between latitude 62 and 63. The report states that the natural and best route to the diggings is via Whitehorse, either by the Klondike trail or by Coffee Creek and Snag River.
