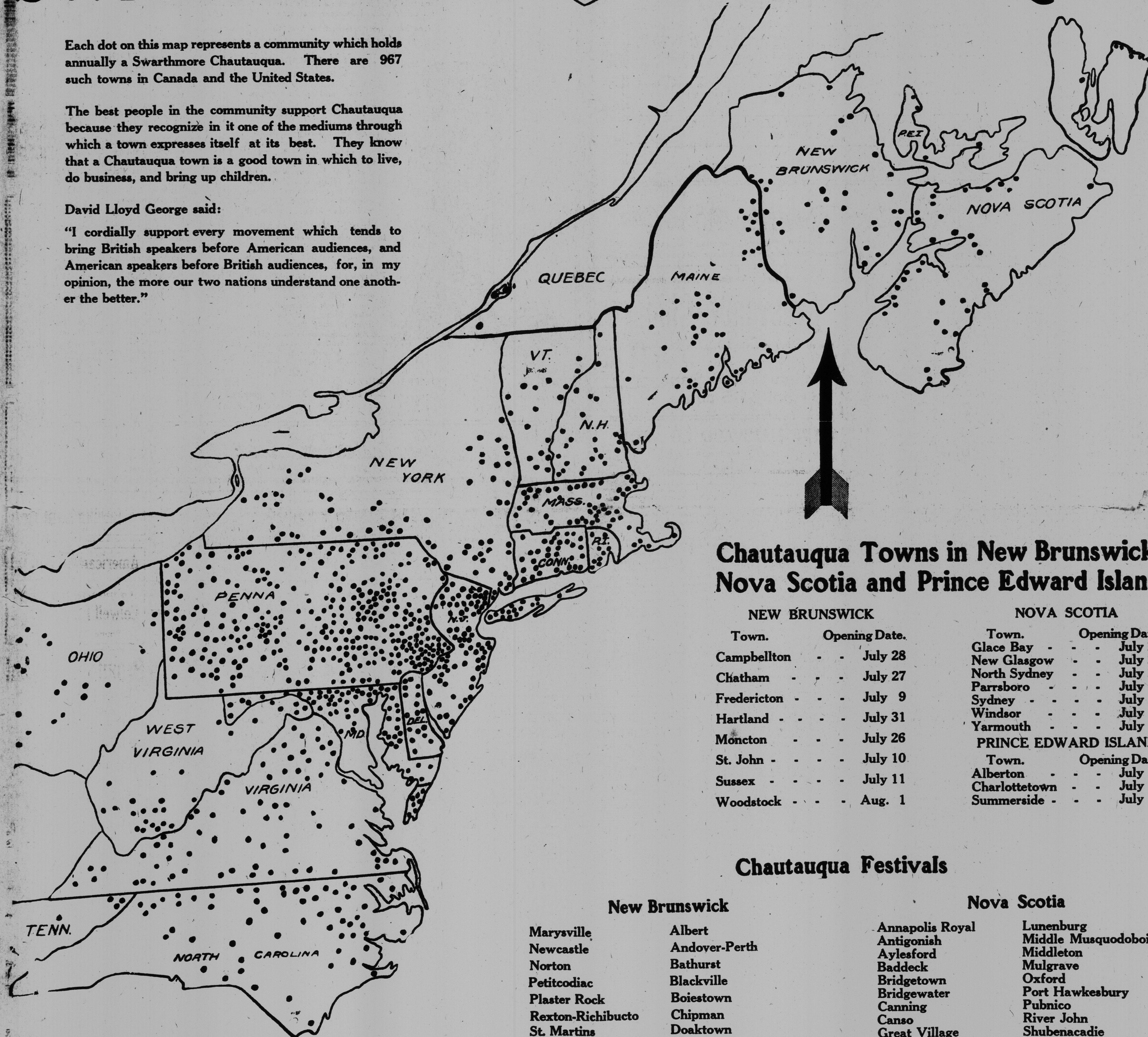
SWARTHMORE CHAUTAUQUA
