What could have been more encouraging than the addresses of Mr. Kent! delivered at the Anniversary recently held in the City, and at the several meetings he subsequently attended—at Windsor, Newport, Horton, Wolfville and Kentville; in all of which the thrilling story of the operations and successes of this noble Institution seemed "ever telling, yet untold"—so varied and vast was the theme.

It will be pleasing to many other Societies in the Province to learn that the Rev. Mr. Kent expects, after fulfilling his engagements at New York, Canada and New Brunswick—whither he is gone—to return by way of Annapolis, Yarmouth and Liverpool, to the city; and to visit Amherst and Picton,—besides intermediate places not mentioned,—of which timely notice will be given.
