A grand ball was given at government house, Fredericton, by Si John Harvey in honor of the occasion. A special meeting of the Common Coun-cil was held here, and a committee ap-pointed to devise a proper means of celebrating the event. This committee reported recommending that £250 be laid out for the purpose of giving the poor a feast on King's and Queen's squares.
