IMMIGRATION SHOWS INCREASE OF 68 P. C.

Greatest Advance in Month of June of This Year.

Immigration to Canada during April, May and June of the present year shows an increase of 68 per cent over the corresponding months in 1919, according to a statement just made public by J. A. Calder, minister of immigration and colonization. The greatest increase is shown in June when the immigration to Canada was 199 per cent greater than in June a year ago. Of the 49,242 immigrants who entered Canada in April, May and June of this year 28,487 were British, 16,397 were from the United States and 4,358 from other countries.

Some interesting figures showing the movement of immigration previous to the war, during the war and in the year since the war are also presented. In the five years previous to the war the total immigration to Canada was 1,461,423, of which 37 per cent were British, 36 per cent from the United States and 27 per cent from other countries. During the war period immigration from Great Britain fell off very greatly and from the United States considerably. The total from all countries was 405,476, of which 18 per cent were British and 67 per cent from the United States. With the conclusion of the war British immigration showed a rapid increase and the proportions for the first year after the war are 51 per cent British, 42 per cent from the United States and the remainder from other countries. The shipping situation is still a factor limiting British immigration, but this is gradually being corrected. The figures showing rejections of immigrants desiring to enter Can-

ada indicate the vigilance of the department in this connection. During the five years previous to the war 92,745 persons were rejected, the rejections rose to 19 per cent than five per cent of the total immigration. During the war period the rejections rose to 19 per cent of the total immigration and during the first year after the war they have been 17 per cent. Deportations for the five year period before the war amounted to 5,522 persons, or about one-third of one per cent of the immigration. During the war period the deportations were 4,353 or somewhat over one per cent of the total immigration. For the first year after the war deportations dropped to 655, which is about one-half of one per cent of the immigration.

Last year 711 Japanese entered Canada, which is slightly less than the average during the war period when the total immigration was 740 persons. For the five years prior to the war the average Japanese immigration was 611 persons per year. Chinese immigration also shows a falling off, the number last year being 544 against an average of 1,388 during each year of the war and an average of 5,228 during the five years prior to the war.

Immigration to Canada from all sources during the fiscal year 1919-20 totalled 57,702 persons. During the fiscal year 1919-20 the total rose to 117,336 persons, and during April, May and June of the present year 49,242 immigrants have entered Canada.

B. C. WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION BOARD INCREASES DOCTORS' ALLOWANCES

Under a new schedule compiled by the Workmen's Compensation Board of British Columbia, medical fees for doctors on all cases coming under the scope of the Board are to be increased from 25 to 30 per cent. This is the first increase in fees allowed by the Board since 1917 and is lower than recognized by the Medical Association.

ALBERTA COMPENSATION BOARD TO ASSIST IN SAFETY WORK

As the result of a conference between the Workmen's Compensation Board of Alberta and representatives of employers and employees falling within the scope of the Workmen's Compensation Act, a set of regulations for the prevention of accidents has been issued by the board coming into effect this month. The board states that the solution of the problem of accident prevention lies to a large extent in the installation of proper mechanical guards about dangerous machinery and an organized educational campaign among the workmen to secure greater care and better judgment in carrying on their work. These rules contain provisions for the guarding of all machinery, in specified ways, the wearing of suitable clothing by the workers, provision for the safe operation of cranes and derricks, and special safety rules for sawmills, lath mills, wood working, laundries, candy making, building construction. The

regulations also provide for the formation of a safety committee of two or more members in every manufacturing plant, workshop or other industrial undertaking where ten or more workmen are employed.

MOOSE JAW TRADES COUNCIL. At the regular meeting of the Moose Jaw Trades and Labor Council last week ex-Alderman Watson, president of the central Labor body, was chosen as the Moose Jaw delegate to the annual Trades and Labor Congress which convenes in Windsor in September next.

Outside of the naming of Mr. Watson as its delegate the council did very little other than routine business. It endorsed the action of the Gordon Ironsides and Fares employees in so far as they have gone with their negotiations with the company in the matter of a new schedule. It also appointed a committee to draw up a programme for the Labor Day celebration, and fixed Friday evening as the date for a general organization meeting in the Board of Trade to further the aims of the council in regard to the Labor Day sports.
