Another "Globe" Invention. The St. John Globe, in its eagerness to assist the friends of the local government, stated on Saturday last, the truth that they held a party meeting in the Government rooms in St. John, and it proceeded to deliver a "virtuous lecture" on the subject, claiming that neither the friends of the government nor those of the opposition have any right to make such use of the rooms in question. The Globe has, for some time, been inventing all kinds of canvases against the government, while pretending to be its candid friend, and while its support or opposition is not a matter of much moment to any party, considering its unreliability, it ought to show some in the matter of inventing and publishing absolute falsehoods.

The Governor's speech. There does not seem to be any difference of opinion anywhere as to who ought to be the successor of Lieut. Governor McClellan, and it may, therefore, be assumed that he will accept the honor—which he ought to do when it is tendered—Senator Snowball will, very early in the present year, be Governor of New Brunswick. It goes without saying, that no more fitting choice could be made from both political and social standpoints.

The Intercolonial. An Ottawa despatch of last Friday says: The accounts of the Intercolonial Railway for the fiscal year ending on the 31st of June 30 last show earnings of \$4,972,235, and working expenses of \$5,450,422, leaving a deficit of \$478,187. Both revenue and expenses are larger than for the previous year, but the loss of \$478,187 is not so great as it is at first sight, inasmuch as the deficit is in itself so accounted for.

Half-year and the I. C. R. In connection with the Halifax movement for the transfer of the I. C. R. to the C. P. R. it was stated by members of the Halifax Board of Trade that I. C. R. cars were used on the Grand Trunk, but the Grand Trunk would not permit its cars to be used on the I. C. R.

The financial statement of the province which has just been issued by the Auditor General, shows the Provincial Treasury to be thoroughly solvent notwithstanding the enormous extra expenditures that have been necessary during the present year. At the last session of the House, it was explained that late in the fall the roads and bridges of the country had been damaged to a degree which at the time had not been thoroughly ascertained. There never had been so much damage done to the roads nor so many bridges carried away in such a short space of time before. What would be done to put the roads in a passable condition was done during the fall and winter, but the spring freshets again did serious damage and many of the weaker bridges of the country went out or were seriously damaged. Few people appreciate the enormous number of bridges which the Provincial Board of Works has under its charge in different sections of the province. This number is 10,100 and they vary from five and ten feet spans to the great bridges which cross the St. John river at different points as well as others along the north shore which have lately been constructed.

Were Rundle and his men "celebrating" on Christmas eve? London, Dec. 27.—Mr. Rundle has always been very strict in that part of the Orange River Colony which was the scene of Gen. De Wet's Christmas coup. A great quadrangle of blockhouses is being built there, the four points of which are Vrenging, Volkrans, Harmsmit and Kromstad. At the southeast corner of the quadrangle is a long open space from Heilbrunn to Lindley, where the squares of blockhouses is still incomplete, and here De Wet made his attack. Col. Firmans' force probably amounted to 400 men, and the disaster, especially the loss of the guns, the possession of which may enable De Wet successfully to attack the blockhouses, creates a disturbing impression.
