### BUTLER WILL LEAVE FOR SYDNEY TODAY

Lewis Introduces Another Interesting Bill.

OTTAWA, Feb. 7-M. J. Butler, the retiring deputy minister of railways and anals, leaves tomorrow for Sydney to assume his duties of office as new general manager of the Iron and Steel Company. Mr. A. W. Campbell, the new deputy minister, wil take up the duties of the office here on the 15th

instant.

At the opening of the Commons to-day, Mr. E. N. Lowis drew the attention of the government to the fact that the passengers and crew of the sinking steamer Kentucky off Cape Hatteras had been saved through the operation of the American government's wireless telegraphy station on the coast. Mr. Lewis urged the government to take steps to protect all the Canadian trade routes, both on the Pacific and Atlantic coasts and on the Great Läkes, by the installation of wireless stations.

At is the intention of the government to protect our trade routes not only by wireless telegraphy, but also by a Canadian navy, replied Sir Wilfrid Laurier.
