ALLIED GOVERNMENTS PROVIDING FOR THE SERBIAN REFUGEES

Food and clothing in large supplies being sent forward to stricken country

London, Dec. 13.—The Allied governments have taken steps to provide for the needs of the Serbian refugees, as far as possible.

"Ample supplies of food and clothing and facilities for shelter are being provided at the most likely points, in co-operation with the Serbian relief committee," said Lord Robert Cecil, under-parliamentary secretary of state for foreign affairs, in the House of Commons today.

"There are great difficulties to be surmounted, and in certain areas it is not known what the extent of the influx of refugees will be.

"Howayer, I believe the numbers to be provided for will not be so large as at present supposed."
