The C. P. O. S. liner Sleight, due
here next week, has on board 23 re-

Schooner Dragged Ashore.
The schooner Isiah K. Stetson, from
Liverpool, N. S., for New York via
Portland, was dragged ashore on the
East side of City Island, N. Y., Friday
night, by ice and strong northwest
winds, but with the assistance of the
tug C. A. Lorman she was refloated
on Saturday at noon.

Danger to Steamers.
The presence of the ice in the lane
between the schooner Isiah K. Stetson,
which arrived at New York on Janu-
ary 23rd, said that while on the voy-
age from a foreign port he was com-
pelled to change his course thirty
miles because he discovered icebergs
in the vicinity of the Grand Banks,
indicating that the ice was breaking
up one month earlier than usual. Two
large bergs and drifting ice were ob-
served coming south towards the pas-
sage used in transatlantic travel at
this time of the year.

The presence of the ice in the lane
serves as a menace to navigation and
will undoubtedly compel vessels to
take the southern route before the cus-
tomary time.

That There is a Variance Be-
tween Republicans in
House and Senate Over
Compulsory Military Train-
ing Comes Out.

Washington, Jan. 27.—The variance
between Republican leaders of the
Senate and House on enactment of
universal military training legislation
today came out in the open. Closely
following incorporation, yesterday, of
a universal provision in the army re-
organization bill by the Senate Mil-
itary Commission, with seven out of
nine Republicans voting in the affir-
mative, Representative Modell, of
Wyoming, Republican leader in the
House, declared in an address that
heads of the party responsible for
inauguration of such legislation would
be cast into oblivion.

The Government, Modell told the
House, would be compelled to spend
one billion dollars and to raise the
money by a bond issue to put the uni-
versal training plan into operation.
Senator Wadsworth, of New York,
chairman of the Military Committee,
yesterday announced that adoption of
the four months' of training for all
youths between the ages of 18 and 21,
exclusive, would enable such a re-
duction in the regular army expendi-
ture of \$1,100,000,000 to approximately
\$500,000,000.

U. S. AMBASSADOR
QUITS HIS POST
IN MEXICO

Washington, Jan. 27.—(By A. P.)—
Henry Fletcher has resigned as U. S.
Ambassador to Mexico to take effect in
the course of the next few weeks.
Those who know the reason for Mr.
Fletcher's decision say that he was
convinced that a continuation of the
efforts he has made during the four
years he has held the important pos-
ition, to bring Mexico to the United
States Government, on the many irri-
tating issues which have arisen, involv-
ing the taking of American lives and
property rights, would be futile.
