The Committee cannot conclude this Report without making an earnest appeal to the members of our Holy Communion, especially in this City, for increased liberality in this the day of the Church's trial and need. That our lot is cast in a day of opposition and rebuke is known to all, and felt by most of us. Our Zion has enemies on every side, for her warfare is not accomplished, and every year seems to add to their boldness and their virulence. And when the enemies of our Church thus combine to accomplish her ruin, shall not her friends unite their efforts to uphold and protect her; when the cry of the adversary is—"down with her to the dust," shall not her devoted children unite, that by persevering prayer, and combined effort, and cheerful unwearying support, they may make her what her Divine constitution has fitted her to be, and her Divine Head has intended her to be, a joy and a praise in the earth.

As a Church we are set not only for the defence of the truth, but also for the spread of the truth,—not only to preserve it but also to propagate it,—and never does the Church discharge her sacred trust so well, as when ceasing to act upon the defensive, she plants the standard of her great Captain on territories not hitherto possessed. And never does the lamp of the Church dispense such gladdening light as when it illumes the dark places, where the people are perishing because there is no vision. And never do the strong holds of error so totter to their basis, as when the "trumpet of Jubilee is the weapon

of assault."

The Report having been read-

The LORD BISHOP moved the first Resolution, viz.:

I.—Resolved, That the Report just read, be received, printed, and circulated under the direction of the General Committee.

Which being seconded by the Hon. H. G. Pineo, M. L. C. was agreed to.

The Rev. Mr. Bullock moved the second Resolution:

II.—Resolved. That while we rejoice in the success which has attended the labours of our first Visiting Missionaries, and desire to express our gratitude to God; we trust it will serve as an effective call for the increased exertions of the Church throughout the Province to send forth more labourers into the harvest.
