To be examined, and a certificate of approbation granted, by a Board of Examiners, before they are admitted to practise.	3
Board how constituted.
What to be stated in their certificates.
Certificates to avail as an authority to practise.
Persons applying to produce to the Board certificates of good character, and to perform practical operations.
Persons receiving such certificates shall take the oath hereby prescribed, and give security for faithful discharge of duty.	4
To produce their commissions, within one month after receiving the same, at the office of the Court of King's Bench, &c. for the District.	5
Under a penalty for default.
And to declare their place of residence.
Declaration to be entered by Prothonotary in a Register.
Fee thereon.
Shall appoint two persons of probity, as Chain-bearers, in Surveying Lands.	6
Shall administer an oath to them.
Shall place certain boundary marks, when required by parties.	7
Shall draw up and keep <i>Procès Verbaux</i> of their surveys and read them to and cause them to be signed by the parties, &c.	8

A meridian line to be drawn and marked near Quebec, Montreal and Three Rivers by the Surveyor General, or a Surveyor appointed by the Governor.
