### GRANT, ALEXANDER. (Pictou.)

S. of Hugh Grant, a native of Scotland. B. in Pictou Co. in 1830 and ed. at the Academy there. M., 5 Mar. 1856. A merchant. Has been a School Commr. and a Municipal Councillor and is now Mayor of Stellarton. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—Stellarton, N.S.

# HEMEON, ALBERT. M. (Queen's.)

Descended from a U.E. Loyalist, who settled in N.S. at the time of the Revolutionary War. B in Shelburne, 1843, and ed. at the Academy and Normal Coll., Truro, N.S. M., 1864, L.W. McVicar. A merchant. Has been a School Trustee and Secty. of the Board, a Justice of the Peace and Warden of Queen's Co. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at election held March 1887, to fill vacancy created by the resignation of Mr. J. M. Mack. Re-elected at last g.e. An Independent Liberal.—Liverpool, N.S.

# JOHNSTON, Hon. THOMAS. (Shelburne.)
