

Prohibitory Liquor Law of N.B. was the work of Mr. Tilley as a private mem.; amongst other measures of importance introduced and carried by the Govt. of which he was a mem. may be mentioned the following: Vote by ballot and extension of the franchise; an Act authorizing the construction of the European and North American Railway as a Govt. work; an Act authorizing the construction of the Intercolonial Railway, N.B., agreeing to pay three-and-a-half-twelfths of the cost; an Act granting facility for the construction of certain Railways, under which 230 miles have since been built in N. B. On the formation of Sir J. A. Macdonald's Administration in 1878, the re-adjustment and re-organization of the Customs Tariff in accordance with the policy of that Govt. which had for its object the protection and fostering of Canadian industry. The work involved much study and labor. Returned to Commons at g.e. 1878, and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*St. John, N.B.; St. Andrews; Brunswick Place, Metcalfe Street, Ottawa.*

TOWNSHEND, CHARLES JAMES, Q.C. (*Cumberland.*) 2ND MEM.

Descended from the Townshends of Norfolk, Eng. S. of the Rev. Canon Townshend, Rector of Amherst, N.S., and grand-s. of the late Hon. Alex. Stewart, Master of the Rolls and Judge of the Court of Vice-Admiralty at Halifax. B. at Amherst, N.S., 22 March 1844. Ed. at the Collegiate Sch. and at King's Coll., Windsor, N.S.; graduated with honors, June 1862; obtained degrees of B.A. in 1862 and B.C.L. in 1868. Called to the Bar, April 1866. Apptd. a Q.C., Oct. 1880. M., 23 April 1877 at Amherst, Laura, fourth dau. of J. D. Kinnear, Esq. Apptd. a mem. of the Ex. Council, N.S., 22 Oct. 1878. Resigned with his colleagues, July 1882. Sat in Leg. Assem., N. S., from g.e. 1878 to June 1884 when he was returned to the Commons to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Hon. Sir Charles Tupper. A Liberal Conservative.—*Amherst, N.S.*
