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The work devolving upon my department in connection with the administration of "The Companies Act," was largely in excess of that of any previous year as will be seen by a reference to the list of companies incorporated. It will be observed that the number of charters and of supplementary charters granted during the year was ninety-one, showing an aggregate capital stock of \$11,952,000, and representing well nigh every branch of industry.
