

beds and provisions requisite and necessary for the ordinary use of the family of the Applicant.

A person to be appointed in each of the Districts of Quebec, Montreal and Three Rivers for the purpose of visiting Houses of Public Entertainment &c.

Such persons to make a Report to the Justices of the Peace of the state of such houses &c.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Justices of the Peace for each of the District of *Quebec, Montreal* and *Three Rivers*, shall be, and they are hereby authorised to employ, annually, and allow out of any public fund at their disposition, for the purposes of police, a reasonable compensation to a fit and proper person, appointed by a writing or instrument signed by at least of such Justices of the Peace, in their respective Districts, who shall visit and inspect all Houses of Public Entertainment, as well Inns, Hôtels, as Taverns, for which Licenses are granted, and report in writing to such Justices of the Peace the state of the same, and report in writing whether the accommodations for which sureties have been given, as aforesaid, really exist and are afforded to the public, which report of such Visiter and Inspector shall be returned into and remain in the Office of the Peace for the District for the information and use of the Justices of the Peace aforesaid, and others whom it may concern.

Such Visitor to prosecute for all breaches or infractions of bonds to be given pursuant to this Act &c.

III, And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be the duty of the said Visiter and Inspector of Public Houses, to prosecute for all breaches or infractions of any bond to be given pursuant to this Act, as well as for all penalties incurred by any person keeping a House or Place of Public Entertainment without a License, or vending or retailing Liquor contrary to Law, and that such Visiter and Inspector shall be a competent Witness in all cases within his own knowledge, but shall in no case be entitled to any part of any penalty or fine for the recovery whereof he shall have prosecuted.

Persons convicted of any violation of any such bond to forfeit thier licenses &c.

IV- And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every person who shall be convicted of any breach or violation of any such bond shall forfeit his license, and that no person having so forfeited his license, or who shall have been fined for vending or retailing Spirituous Liquors, shall at any time within years thereafter have or obtain a license for keeping a House of Public Entertainment or for retailing Spirituous Liquors.
