Referring to your letter of the 12th inst., I beg to inform you that in 1595, the Canadian Bacific Rwy. Co., paid, in connection with the right of way, for two station grounds in the Peigan Indian reserve. They were named No.5 and No.6 Sidings; one of these has since been entitled "Brocket". Each of their ridths is twelve hundred feet(1200); that is to say six hundred feet on each side of the centre line. No change appears to have been made since that date.
