Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 12th inst., I beg to inform you that in 1898, the Canadian Pacific Rwy. Co., paid, in connection with the right of way, for two station grounds in the Peigan Indian reserve. They were named No.5 and No.6 Sidings; one of these has since been entitled "Brocket". Each of their widths is twelve hundred feet(1200); that is to say six hundred feet on each side of the centre line. No change appears to have been made since that date.

Within recent years the Company has filed plans in connection with a pipe *line* to Brocket Station; some of these plans do not show the correct width of the station ground. On this account the impression may have arisen that the original width was not paid for.
