	3 September		Overcast and partly cloudy. Presentation of Wings to graduates of Course 81 by Air Vice-Marshal J.A. Sully, Air Member for Personnel, A.F.H.Q. The Air Vice-Marshal was introduced by Group Captain A. Raymond, Commanding Officer. (See attached clipping.)	
	4 September		Overcast and hazy. Regular Saturday evening movie held in the Recreation Hall; was well attended and thoroughly enjoyed by all. R83669, W02 Kilmour, K.C., with J23034, F/O D.E. Berry, as second pilot, and R57364, F/S Cusson as passenger, started the port engine of Anson 8355. The hydraulic system collapsed the undercarriage, resulting in a C-3 category accident. No injury. Site of incident: Killaloe Airport, Ontario.	
	5 September		Overcast. In compliance with a request from His Excellency, the Governor-General of Canada, special church services were held on this station as they were all over Canada, in commemoration of the four years this country has been at war.
