It is also requested that the duty on foreign tomatoes may be made a specific duty of $\frac{1}{2}$ c. per lb., Empire tomatoes continuing to be admitted free of duty.

It is also desired to suggest an amendment of tariff item 267B (partially refined mineral oil) but the exact details are not yet available.
