The present conditions have completely disorganised our connections, resulting in a withdrawal of all our field forces temporarily from here to Winnipeg.

We expect, however, we will be able to have a man visit Victoria in the near future but untill our Mr. Holland, who is presently in the East, returns, we cannot make a definite promise.

We have no doubt the trouble will be quite easily adjusted as every machine is thoroughly inspected before leaving the factory.
