Tenders for Coal, 1904.

Sealed tenders, addressed to the Provincial Secretary, Parliament buildings, Toronto, marked "Tenders for Coal," will be received up to noon on Monday, May 23rd, for the delivery of such quantities and qualities of coal in the sheds of the following Provincial institutions, on or before the 15th of July next, viz.:—Toronto, London, Kingston, Hamilton, Mimico, Brockville, Cobourg, Orillia and Penetang Asylums; also the Central Prison, Mercer Reformatory, Deaf and Dumb Institute, Belleville, Blind Institute, Brantford.

Specifications of the quantities and qualities of coal required and forms of application may be obtained on application to the Department, or from the Bursars of the respective institutions.

Tenders are to specify the mine of origin and the quality of respective kinds of coal, and furnish evidence on delivery that the coal is of origin specified, fresh mined and up to standard of trade grades. Delivery subject to satisfaction of officers of Department of the Provincial Secretary, who may require additional deliveries, not exceeding 20 per cent., up to 15th of July, 1905.

Tenders will be received for the whole quantity specified, or for the quantities required in each institution. An accepted check for \$500, payable to the order of the Honorable the Provincial Secretary, must be furnished by each tenderer, and two sufficient surties will be required for the due fulfillment of each contract. The lowest or any tender not necessarily accepted.
