vent the barbouring of Deserters from His Majesty's Army, and the Sale of Arms, Accontrements and Clothing belonging to His Majesty.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Council, and defire their concur-

rence to the same.

A Bill for repairing the Screets, &c. in the Town of Halifax, and also,

A Bill for fecuring the Owners of Land in the western parts of Londonderry, in the peaceable enjoyment of their Lands, were severally read a second time.

Refolved, That the faid Bills be committed to a Committee of the whole House.

On Motion of Mr. Chipman, refolved, That a Committee be appointed to examine into the expenditure of Monies granted for the service of Roads throughout the Province during the past year, and report thereon specially to the House.
