“To HIS EXCELLENCY the Lieutenant Governor for the pay-  
 “ment of the Adjutants of the several Regiments of Militia for  
 “the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety five, a sum not  
 “exceeding *one hundred and sixty pounds*.

“To HIS EXCELLENCY the Lieutenant Governor for defray-  
 “ing an expence incurred by the Mayor, Aldermen and Com-  
 “monalty of the city of Saint John in maintaining and securing  
 “divers prisoners apprehended in the United States and con-  
 “veyed to the Gaol of Saint John charged with having com-  
 “mitted Piracy, the sum of *twelve pounds six shillings and seven*  
 “*pence*.

“To the Honorable *George Leonard*, Esquire, *Joshua Gidney*  
 “and *James Hughson* for completing the road from Kennebecka-  
 “cies to Jimseg in order to establish a communication between  
 “Fredericton and the city of Saint John the sum of *fifty pounds*.

“To John Holland, Esquire, late Sheriff of the city and coun-  
 “ty of Saint John for his extra trouble in keeping the Prisoners  
 “committed to the Gaol of Saint John from the other parts of  
 “the province the sum of *twenty pounds*.

“To Thomas Wetmore, Esquire, for services performed by  
 “him in preparing sundry bills and other assistances of Clerk-  
 “ship rendered the House of Assembly the sum of *ten pounds*.

“To HIS EXCELLENCY the Lieutenant Governor for defray-  
 “ing expences of the Province a sum not exceeding *one hun-*  
 “*dred pounds*.

“*Resolved*, That it is the opinion of this committee that there  
 “be granted to HIS MAJESTY for defraying the expences of  
 “the current services of this province for the year one thou-  
 “sand seven hundred and ninety six, the following sums, to wit:

“To the Speaker of the House of Assembly for his services  
 “during that session and for his travelling charges the sum of  
 “*fifty pounds*.

“To the other Members of the House of Assembly for defray-  
 “ing their expences of attendance during that session and travel-  
 “ling charges, reckoning *twenty miles* to each day's travel, to be  
 “certified by the Speaker the sum of *seven shillings and six pence*  
 “per diem.

“To
