- "To the Honorable George Leonard, Esquire, Joshua Gidney and James Hughson for completing the road from Kennebeckacies to Jimseg in order to establish a communication between Fredericton and the city of Saint John the sum of sifty pounds.
- "To John Holland, Esquire, late Sheriss of the city and county of Saint John for his extra trouble in keeping the Prisoners committed to the Gaol of Saint John from the other parts of the province the sum of twenty pounds.
- "To Thomas Wetmore, Esquire, for services performed by him in preparing sundry bills and other affistances of Clerk"ship rendered the House of Assembly the sum of ten pounds.
- "To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor for defray"ing expenses of the Province a sum not exceeding one hun"dred pounds.
- "Refolved, That it is the opinion of this committee that there be granted to His Majesty for defraying the expenses of the current services of this province for the year one thoughand seven hundred and ninety six, the following sums, to wit:
- "To the Speaker of the House of Assembly for his services during that session and for his travelling charges the sum of sty pounds.
- "To the other Members of the House of Assembly for defraying their expences of attendance during that session and travelling charges, reckoning twenty miles to each day's travel, to be
