OPERATION SUCCESSFUL.

British neadquarters in France, June 4—(via Reuter's Ottawa agen-cy)—Our operations in the neigh-borhood of Vieux Berquin were completely successful and have given us some high ground and two farms which had been converted into machine gun posts. Our casualties were light although the enemy rewere light although the enemy resisted with considerable obstinacy. Our raid to the east of Tilley on Saturday was a most daring enterprise. We penetrated the enemy's lines to a depth of more than a thousand yards and cleared out four hundred yards of German trenches, bombing all dugouts and blowing up a heavy trench mortar, which had been troublesome. Prisoners estimate that an entire German company was wiped out.

GET READY FOR CAN-

Although it is still early in the season, be forehanded in your preparations to take care of the fruit and vegetable crop. Don't wait until July before ordering your canning outfit or pre-serving jars. Don't wait until the vegetables become overgrown, old, tough or stringy before you can

Make this a record canning and drying year. That is one of the objects of your war garden. And start early. Pickle young beets

right now.

Conservative estimates show that 5,000,000 gardeners can produce, the equivalent of enough food to sustain 1,000,000 soldiers for 238 days, or almost eight months. Each individual home gardener this year should make it a point to study the comparative food value of the different vegetables and to concentrate on those which add most to the country's food supply. Cabbage, for instance, is 98 per cent. water and requires at least 100 days to become fit for food. On the other hand, beans represent food in highly concentrated form, mature readily and the dry product is easy to keep.
