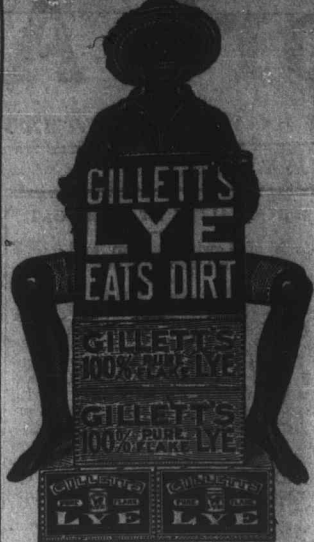
As it might have been written— By Tennyson— And so the lad in simplest garb arrayed, Reposed him in an angle of the wall Upon a wooden bench of rustic form.

FOUR YEARS SENTENCE FOR ASSAULT

KENTVILLE, Jan. 17—Judge Webster in County Court this afternoon sentenced Harold Atwell, age 24, of Gasperau, to four years in Dorchester Penitentiary. The count on which he was convicted was unlawful assault, with intent to cause grievous bodily harm on Rodney Davidson, of Gasperau.

Atwell was sent up for trial at a preliminary hearing before Stipendiary Magistrate Strong, and elected to be tried at Speedy Trials.

H. W. Sangster, of Windsor, made a strong plea for clemency on behalf of the accused, giving as reasons that the surroundings the young man had been brought up in were not of the best, and he personally believed that his client had learned his lesson and would make a law-abiding citizen in the future.

Evidence brought out by Crown Prosecutor Roscoe showed that the accused had been arrested five previous times in Wolfville for drunkenness and fighting, and that on another occasion he had been put under bonds to keep the peace. These expired a year ago.

Judge Webster, before passing sentence, said that he believed the trouble with the accused was that he had been drinking too much liquor, and that he was liable to do anything when he was in that state, and that the community must be protected, at all costs.
