JUSTICE IN HAYTI.

MEN CONDEMNED TO DEATH ON CURIOUS CHARGES.

One Because He Had Made a Coat for Another Man; a Second Because Rifles Had Been Found in the Houses on Both Sides of His.

New York, Nov. 13.—Private advices from responsible foreign sources in Hayti give details of the execution of five political prisoners, recently reported in a despatch from Minister Furness to the State Department. According to these advices, some few weeks ago several men were arrested and condemned to death on the charge of conspiracy against the Government. One of the men was condemned because he had made a military coat for another man, and another was condemned because he lived in a house between two others, and in each of the two a rifle had been found. On October 30 someone put a rifle cartridge on the tram lines, and the first engine passing exploded it. The President at once had five of the condemned men taken to the burial ground, and shot. The names of the five men were Helvetine Traversiere, Alexander Delaunay Moise, Nestor Dumay, Edouard Edouard and Exime Jean.

AUTO-BOAT

Can Travel on Both Land and Water.

New York, Nov. 13.—The Tribune says: Flying the French and American flags and a yacht club pennant at the bow, the little French "Blue-boat on Wheels," Waterland I, was conveyed by eleven automobiles, filled with electricians and other experts, to port Washington point, where the combination boat and automobile was to take a plunge in the North River. The little boat took her initial plunge at 2:30 p.m. Driven by its small propeller, the shaft of which is coupled to a 20-horse power motor, the boat went out a hundred yards and returning at a good speed, mounted the beach and came out high and dry.

FROM LIVING TOMB.

Rescued After Being Entombed Underground For Days.

Pottsville, Pa., Nov. 13.—Imprisoned for 87 hours, several hundred feet beneath the surface of the earth, almost directly under his own home, where his wife and children mourned for him as dead, Michael McCabe, of Gilberton, was to-day taken from his tomb in the Draper mine, barely alive, after one of the most marvelous rescues in the history of anticaric mining.

HOTEL MEN ACQUITTED.

Prosecutions in Owen Sound So Far Not Successful.

Owen Sound, Nov. 13.—Police Magistrate A. D. Cressor dismissed with costs the cases against Andrew Fogarty, of the Albion Hotel, and James Henderson, of the Grand Central. The cases were entered on the evidence of a private detective from Toronto, engaged by a local committee, and are amongst about a dozen of a similar character which the Police Magistrate will hear. The charge against James Agnew was also dismissed.

YOUNG GIRL SHOT DEAD.

A Painful Tragedy at Travers, Ont. Pictou, Nov. 13.—A sad accident occurred at Point Traverse, this county, to-day. The two children of a Mr. Farrington, Viola, aged sixteen, and her younger brother, were alone in the house. Viola was in one room and her brother in another. The brother states he heard a rifle shot and upon going into the room where his sister was found her dead with a rifle lying beside her. She had, it is supposed, been playing with the gun, which was loaded, and accidentally discharged it, killing herself instantly.

FIREMAN LOST HIS LIFE.

Pinned Between Engine and Tender in Wreck at St. Polycarpe. Montreal, Nov. 13.—As the result of a collision between two ballast trains at St. Polycarpe station, on the Grand Trunk Ottawa division, at a late hour last night, Fireman A. E. Hopi lost his life, two engines were badly smashed and three cars were rendered useless. The Fireman Hopi was pinned between the engine and tender. He died at 2 o'clock. He was a resident of Montreal.

FELL THIRTY FEET.

London Carpenter Had Narrow Escape From Death. London, Ont., Nov. 13.—While Contractor R. G. Wilson was at work at the Adelaide Street Baptist Church doing some repairing, the scaffold gave way, and he fell a distance of nearly thirty feet. Fortunately his fall was broken by the scaffolding braces, which probably saved his life. He is at present under the doctor's care.

GALT POST-OFFICE SHAKEN.

Two Furnaces Blown Up and the Caretaker Injured. Galt, Ont., Nov. 13.—A terrific explosion occurred this afternoon at 3 o'clock in the basement of the post office, entirely demolishing the two furnaces used for heating the building and inflicting serious injuries on Thomas Barrett, the caretaker.
