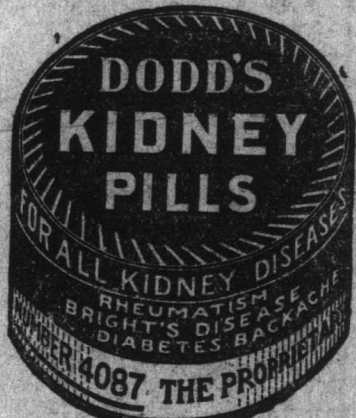
How is that for philosophy? Pretty good, I call it.

Household Notes.

In making tea allow a teaspoonful for each person.
