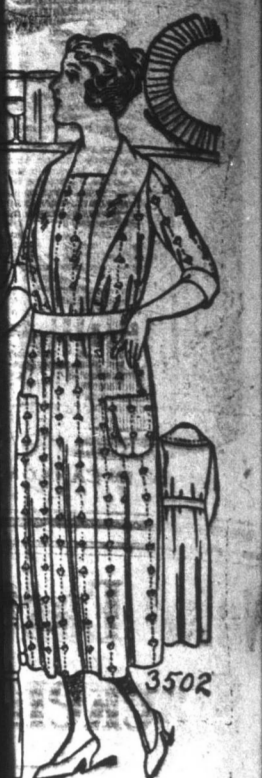

Near East Tension Slackening Appreciably

Alarm However Prevails in Constantinople -- Labor Party Provides Ample Ammunition For Opponents -- Ten Thousand Russians Will be Sent to Bulgaria and France--Relief Forces and Supplies Being Rushed to Earthquake Area.

CONSTANTINOPLE IN FERMENT.

LONDON, Nov. 13. The Lausanne Peace Conference postponed to November 20th, the possibility of maintaining peace in Constantinople in the interim. Reaction of communication has un-dermined such an ugly situation that to prevent the outbreak of a civil war will be necessary to prevent a violent outbreak. Residents of Constantinople are described as in a constant state of alarm, and the Al-positions is rapidly becoming un-pleasant. An English bookseller, in-cluded in a street squabble, was tak-en to the Galata Police Station and re-leased.

TURKS QUIETEN DOWN.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 13. There was an appreciative slackening today of the tension which pre-vailed during the week end over the minds of the Kemalists for greater news in Constantinople. Although a formal announcement has been made it was stated in Allied circles that sober reflection by the Turks seemed them to decide to make no further provocative gestures before the opening of the Lausanne Confer-ence.

LONDON, Nov. 12. THE SULTAN'S STATEMENT.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 13. Palace officials informed the Associated Press Correspondent that the Sultan is without formal official declarations of the Ankara Government regarding his status as Sovereign, and said that he would continue to discharge the functions of his office as long as three hundred million Moslems remained faithful to the prophet's successor.

ANTI-KEMALISTS HANGED.

ANGORA, Nov. 13. Eight leading Turkish opponents of the Kemalist regime have been hanged, including Ruchid Bey, former Minister of Justice; General Emir Pasha, former Commandant of Constantinople, and Colonel Fettabey, former member of the Military Tribunal.

RELIEF ACTIVITIES IN CHILL.

SANTIAGO, Nov. 13. Relief forces are being rushed to aid the thousands made homeless by earthquakes through Chill early on Saturday morning. Broken communi-cations prevent news of details and it is not known to what extent is damage done, but it is believed that at least a thousand are dead. The sea is still rough but it is quiet on land, and relief operations are pro-ceeding toward the aid of the injured and the housing of the homeless.

SIMS IS PRO-BRITISH.

TORONTO, Nov. 13. "I am pro-British," said W. S. Sims, retired Rear Admiral of the United States Navy, addressing the Canadian Club, "in fact I am characterized by the Hearst papers as the most popu-lar British Admiral in the American Navy. I like the British because they are good sports and will stand the gaff without whimpering. You can torpedo a British sailor until he is blue in the face but he will go back to sea."

MONTREAL, Nov. 13. The appointment is announced to-day of Alexander Dick, formerly gen-eral sales agent of the Dominion Coal Company, to the position of general manager of coal sales of the British Steel Corporation.

FAVORABLE POSITION OF CAN-ADIAN DOLLAR.

NEW YORK, Nov. 13. The New York Trust Company to-day shipped one million dollars in gold coin to Canada. This is the fourth shipment of the kind made by the Company since Sept. 14th. The movement of gold to Canada has assumed considerable importance late-ly because of the favorable position of the Canadian dollar in New York. On the money market it was quoted to-day at 1/2 of one per cent. premium.

A Message of Hope.

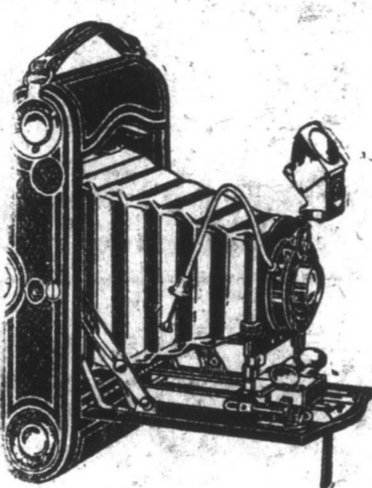
