

#### Household Notes.

To clear fat, boil it in water, sal and cool.

Serve Welsh rabbit on toast with a alad of greens, and cocoa. If your meat course seems light, let a nourishing soup preceed it. To clean undressed kid, rub it very

lightly with fine sandpaper.

Cornbread has a particularly nice flavor when shortened with bacon fat. Brooms and mops last longer if they are hung and not set on the floor. Less butter will be wasted at the table if it is served in balls or blocks.

Eggs that are to be preserved should not be more than four days old. Never soak steel knives in hot water, or their handles will become loose. Tea, coffee and spices should be kept in covered boxes lest they lose
