The following is the bill of Mr. Gladstone to "prevent, for a limited time, new appointments in the Church of Ireland, and to restrain, for the same period, in certain respects, the proceedings of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Ireland.

1. In the vacancy of any archbishoptic or bishopric, or of any acclesiastical dignity or benefice in Ireland in the gift of her Majesty, or to which all archbishops bishops, or other ecclesiastical corporate as such, or any trustee or trustees actin in a public capacity, are or shall be entitled to present or appoint, it shall in be lawful to appoint any person to su ceed to such archbishopric, bishopric, dignity, or benefice, and upon the happeing of such vacancy, the managemes and receipt of the rents and profits, all the lands, titles, and other emoluments appertaining to such archbishopric, bishopric, dignity, or benefice, shall be transferred to and vested in the Ecclesiastica Commissioners for Ireland, subject to a charges legally affecting the same, an the said commissioners for Ireland, subject to a charges legally affecting the same, an arroper management thereof, and shal cause the same and the proceeds thereof to be kept distinct from all other fund to be disposed of in such a manner aparliament may direct.

2. In case of the vacancy of any arc bishopric or bishopric, the person design ated by the 3lst section of the 3rd 4th William the Fourth, chapter 37. execute the powers of the said act durit such vacancy, shall be the guardian the spiritual time of such archbishopric bishopric; and in case of the vacancy any benefice with cure of souls, all apowers and authorities granted by the 116th section of the said act for supplying the spiritual wants of suspended benefice shall apply and be exercised in respect on the duties to be discharged.
