A CONTRAST.—The Hon. The session of our Local Parliament, which was to take place early, is being put off from month to month, and is now said to be contemplated for next February only. These delays, and the constant absence of ministers from their posts, tend to prove that their services might be altogether dispensed with. Public sentiment is fast running in that direction.—Montreal Witness.
