men are entombed. So terrific was the explosion that a car and pieces of the railroad track were hurled from the bottom to the top of the shaft, more than 600 feet, demolishing a steel tipple.

It is impossible to reach the miners and their fate is unknown. A large force of men are trying to clear away the wreckage, but the work is progressing slowly. Unless the men are reached soon it is believed they will certainly be suffocated.

The names of the entombed miners are George Reed, Patrick Dailey, Perdy Stevens and John Holmes.
