

If, for any reason, the head set is believed to be damaged in any way, there is an easy way to test

Place a one-cent piece on the table and on that place a slightly larger piece of tissue paper that had pre-viously been soaked in vinegar. On the wet paper place a five-cent coin. Then another vinegar-soaked paper another cent piece and so on for four or six layers.

Place the head set over your ears and take a tip of the telephone cord in each hand. Touch one tip to the bottom coin, which should be a cent piece, and the other tip to the top oin-a nickel without any paper of

By holding the phone cord tip to the bottom coin and tapping the top nickel coin lightly with the other tip, a clicking noise will be heard if he receivers are in good condition This noise is caused by the closing of an electrical circuit between the coins and the phones. The stack of coins and wet paper form a delicate electric generator.

The efficiency of the phones can be estimated from the amount of coins used in the stack. The lower the stack the better the phones.
